Adolescent Girls' SRHR Digital Platform January – December 2024

1. Project Overview

- **Title:** Adolescent Girls' SRHR Digital Platform
- Location: Western Province (pilot) & Zambia-wide digital reach
- Duration: January December 2024
- Objective: Provide adolescent girls with accessible, stigma-free SRHR information and referral services through a mobile platform and SMS hotline.

2. Background & Rationale

- Adolescents in rural Zambia face barriers in accessing SRHR services due to stigma, distance to clinics, and cultural taboos.
- Mobile penetration is increasing, creating an opportunity for youth-friendly, anonymous platforms.
- The project was designed to address gaps in SRHR knowledge, link users to services, and promote agency among adolescent girls, in line with Zambia's Adolescent Health Strategy and SDG 3 & 5.

3. Activity Components

• **Co-Design Workshops:** 25 adolescents engaged in app design and content development.





- **Platform Development:** Built mobile app and SMS hotline, accessible in English and Lozi.
- Awareness Campaigns: Disseminated information through schools, radio, and community meetings.
- Health Facility Linkages: Partnered with 10 clinics for referral services.
- Monitoring & Data Analytics: Tracked usage, queries, and referral outcomes.

4. Detailed Execution Phases

- Phase 1 Design & Development (Jan–Mar 2024): Youth-led design workshops; platform built and piloted.
- Phase 2 Outreach & Promotion (Apr–Jun 2024): Launched SMS hotline and app; conducted awareness campaigns.
- Phase 3 Service Linkages (Jul–Oct 2024): Integrated platform with clinics for referrals; trained health workers on youth-friendly service delivery.
- Phase 4 Monitoring & Reporting (Nov–Dec 2024): Collected analytics and user feedback; prepared impact report.

5. Implementation Timeline

Design & Development: Jan–Mar 2024

• Outreach & Promotion: Apr-Jun 2024

Service Linkages: Jul–Oct 2024

Monitoring & Reporting: Nov–Dec 2024

6. Outcomes & Impact





- Platform Reach: 5,000 queries received (SMS + app), with 70% from adolescent girls.
- **Knowledge Access:** 3,800 users accessed SRHR content, including contraception and HIV prevention.
- Service Uptake: 200 girls successfully referred to clinics for services.
- Youth Participation: Adolescents co-created content, ensuring relevance and ownership.

- AmplifyChange: Grant provider.
- Airtel Zambia: Supported SMS hotline and subsidized airtime.
- Ministry of Health: Provided technical guidance and clinic integration.
- Youth Advisory Board: Ensured adolescent perspectives guided implementation.
